

### LUNCHEON PROGRAM

On **Saturday, February 15, 2014**, Brandywine Activities will be proud to introduce to the community Damaris Peters Pike, musical historian, teacher, singer and actress, at a luncheon held at the Brandywine Hall. Assuming the persona of Frankie Gershwin, she will perform her own creation; "Frankie Gershwin: Let George Do It." Damaris Peters Pike launched her "Women of Note" in 1988 when she decided to take her knowledge of musical history to the general public by dramatizing women in music. She had discovered, in her courses at Hiram College, that the best way to understand an historical period was to become acquainted with important figures of that period. Her first attempt, "The Second Mrs. Bach" (Johann Sebastian Bach's second wife), was so well received it brought requests for additional character presentations. She developed such characters as Beverly Sills, Delores Hope, Doris Day, and many more. Mrs. Pike has a vast musical background and continues to teach two courses at Hiram College. In "Let George Do It" Damaris Pike shares with the audience the life and songs of the brothers Gershwin, George and Ira, as seen through the eyes of their sister, Frankie, giving us the historical beings of musical theatre. **Lunch will be served at 12:30 PM in the Brandywine Room** followed by the program. Cost is \$12.00.
