FROM THE NEST

Mitigation is always an important subject for me, especially thoughts of storm strength and its effect on dwellings, especially units of a condominium development.

Fact 1: Garage doors that are storm resistant protect the roofs of homes.

Fact 2: However, and that is a broad word, the key to saving the roof on a multiunit structure depends on having all garage doors storm proof.

Fact 3: But, if for instance, the end units of a building have storm protected garage doors, there is better chances of helping the roof remain intact. Chancy, but possible, depending on the degree of the storm.

My greatest suggestion to new owners is, while restyling your units is important to you, give even greater thought to storm protection. Our fortune of enjoying conditions these past 10+ years doesn't mean it isn't possible to change as time passes. Popping a roof becomes the disaster none of us want to face (and that we can all agree with). Keep those wonderful, restyled units, in good condition with the protection of storm proof windows and storm proof garage doors. Know your code requirements and quiz your contractor.
